



Parking Options for Family Weekend


Campus Lots: Parking is free after 4:30 p.m. Friday as well as all day Saturday and Sunday in the lots listed below. Free parking expires Monday morning at 7 a.m.

Lots 4, 16, 19, 26, 34, 35, 37, 39, 40, 41, 43, 45, 51, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 64, 82, and 86 have free parking availability. Please note that each campus parking lot has a sign at the entrance with the lot enforcement times and the lot number. You can find a map and information regarding these lots at map.wisc.edu.

Lot 46: On Saturday, staff from Transportation Services will be selling parking from 7 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Garage/Gated Parking Facilities for Visitors






